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DAY 1: (D) BRISBANE – MELBOURNE – LAUNCESTON

DAY 2: (BLD) GOLDMINES, UNIQUE WILDLIFE AND BEAUTIFUL LOOKOUTS

We enjoy **lunch at Seahorse World** before heading to George Town and Low Head, at the mouth of the Tamar. The Low Head Pilot Station and Maritime Museum has interesting exhibits to view before heading back to Launceston.

DAY 3: (BLD) LAUNCESTON TO SWANSEA

Here we are treated to a symphony of flavours of cloth bound cheddar cheese delights our senses. After a satisfying **lunch** in the café, we set forth to our overnight stay in the coastal haven of Swansea.

DAY 5: (BLD) HISTORICAL HOBART & THE HUON VALLEY

Friday 15 November

Embarking on a sightseeing tour of Hobart, we find ourselves immersed in the echoes of the past, discovering the stories of its convict history. Explore Sullivans Cove and the quaint cottages of Battery Point, the architecture whispering tales from long ago. Grateful for our guide's expertise, we then make our way to the Cascades Female Factory. Here we witness the compelling account of The Proud and the Punished which centres around a resilient female petty criminal who courageously challenges the system of punishment and redemption. Through a poignant dramatization, the story unfolds revealing both tragedy and triumph, showcasing the spirit of a woman enduring the hardships of the female factory. From the historical sites, we head into the picturesque Huon Valley, where nature's beauty astounds us. In the

embrace of the Tahune Forest, we enjoy lunch before experiencing a gentle treetop stroll through its canopy, along the **Tahune Air Walk**, capping off a wonderful day.

DAY 6: (BLD) SALAMANCA MARKETS AND THE PORT ARTHUR HISTORIC SITE Saturday 16 November

The Salamanca Markets are a highlight of a visit to Hobart so we spend some time wandering the stalls along the tree-lined street. From here we experience a humbling visit to the Port Arthur Historic Site, a stirring reminder of the harsh conditions endured by the early European inhabitants. We commence our expedition at the Visitor Interpretative Centre where we are taken on a fascinating journey, leading us through the captivating life of a convict from the moment of his petty crime to the haunting shores of Port Arthur. Pausing for lunch, we are then guided through the Penal Settlement, followed by the opportunity to join a cruise around the Harbour passing the sombre Isle of the Dead. Granted the freedom to explore at our own pace, reflect on those who once trod these grounds and the struggles they endured. We bid farewell to the site to return to Hobart. We pause to admire the wonders of nature gracing the Tasman Peninsula, including the awe-inspiring Tasman Arch and the mesmerizing Devils Kitchen where the wild forces of the environment has carved artistry in the rock.

DAY 8: (BLD) HOBART TO STRAHAN

Monday 18 November

Witness some spectacular scenery making the climb into **Queenstown** before arriving into the coastal haven of **Strahan** for the next two nights.

DAY 9: (BLD) EXPLORING THE GORDON RIVER

DAY 11: (BLD) WOOLNORTH STATION

Thursday 21 November

We have a sensational day planned, starting with a visit to **Woolnorth Station**, Australia's biggest dairy operation. Located in the far North West corner of Tasmania, we explore the historic precinct on a guided tour taking in the old farm buildings, Tasmania's first **wind farm** and interpretive centre. On our tour, we also visit **Cape Grim** where the Bureau of Meteorology has measured the cleanest air in the world since 1976. The cape offers sensational seascape views overlooking the islands off the North West Tip. We enjoy a delicious lunch before we return to our accommodation with the rest of the afternoon at leisure.

DAY 12: (BLD) ARTHUR RIVER TO DEVONPORT

Friday 22 November

Our destination today is to an enchanting corner of untouched beauty. This sacred land stands undisturbed and unblemished by logging, dams or the ravages of fire. While cruising this spectacular part of the world, we are accompanied by a local guide who shares with us a wealth of knowledge on the region's plant life, historical significance and the ancient indigenous tribes who lived here. You'll also witness the feeding of completely wild sea eagles that nest on the banks of the river. Back on dry land we make our way through to **Devonport**.

DAY 13: (BLD) DEVONPORT TO HOBART via THE GREAT LAKE

Saturday 23 November

We embark on a delightful path today, first taking in the charming town of Sheffield, nestled at the foot of Mount Roland. Here, history and art intertwine into vibrant murals, an ode to the creative spirit that thrives within this quirky haven. At Elizabeth Town Ashgrove Cheese Factory invites us to savour their range of award-winning cheeses. From the richness of English county cheeses to unique flavours such as Wild Wasabi cheese. We then venture through the sparsely inhabited and the undeniably breathtaking expanse of the Central Highlands, flanked by the Great Lake. This shimmering gem, harnessed for hydroelectricity, stands as Australia's second largest freshwater lake. Pausing at the lookout grants us a perfect moment for a photo opportunity to capture the pristine landscape. A little further on we break for lunch at the Great Lake Hotel. Having satisfied our appetites, we continue our journey passing through the historically classified town of Bothwell, where the unmistakable Scottish influence leaves its mark on the architecture and streetscape. With a slight detour, we have time to make a stop in Richmond. With its streets paved in history we view Australia's oldest, convict-built bridge. Arriving into Hobart we take time to refresh for a celebratory evening out to commemorate the end of our unforgettable tour.


